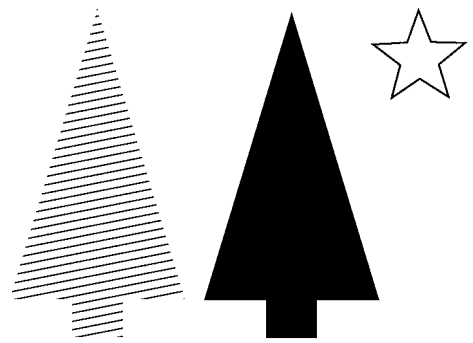
gold (göld) *n.* [ME. OE., akin to G. *gold*, ON. *goll* < IE. base **ghel-*, to shin, gleam, whence GLOW, YELLOW] **1.** a heavy, yellow, inert, metallic chemical element with a high degree of ductility and malleability: it is a precious metal and is used in the manufacture of coins, jewelry, alloys, etc.: symbol, Au; at. wt. 196.967; at. no. 79; sp. gr. 19.4; melt. pt., 1063°C; boil. pt., 2600°C **2.** a) gold coinage b) money; riches; wealth **3.** the bright metallic yellow color of gold **3.** something regarded as having the value, brilliance, etc. of gold -- *adj.* **1.** of, made of, like, or containing gold **2.** having the color of gold **3.** secured by or redeemable in gold; based on gold. 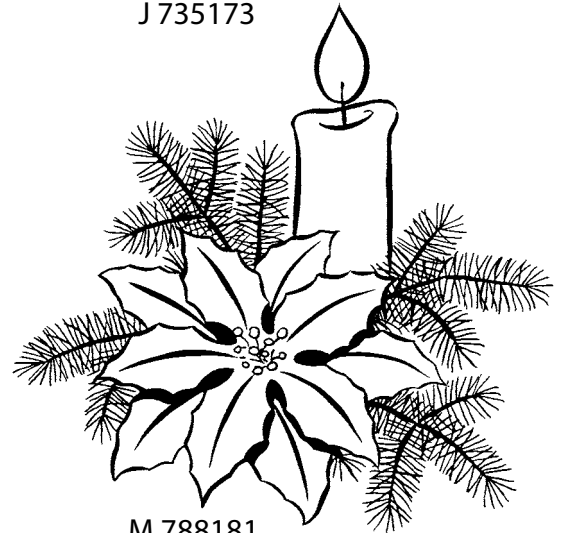
frank-in-cense (frän 'kan sēns') *n.* [M.E. < OE. *franc encens*: see FRANK! & INCENSE!] a sweet smelling gum resin derived from various trees of the genus *Boswellia* which grow in the Middle East and North Eastern Africa. In ancient times frankincense was associated with prayers and burned in purification ceremonies on pagan altars in Rome, Persia, Babylon and Assyria. Trade in frankincense was at its height during the days of the Roman Empire. At that time this resin was considered as valuable as gems or precious metals. One of the gifts of the Magi, it is said that it was presented to the Christ Child by Balthasar, the black king from Ethiopia or Saba, thus fulfilling Isaiah's prophecy that gold and frankincense would be brought from the Gentiles to honor the heavenly king. [Is 60:6] Its principal use now is in the manufacture of incense and pastilles.

Christ-mas (krīs 'mäs) *n.* [M.E. *Cristemas* < OE. *Cristemasse*: see CHRIST & MASS] **1.** a holiday on December 25 celebrating the birth of Jesus Christ. Celebrated by Christians all over the world it's customs vary by location. The most universal custom being the giving of wrapped gifts. It is the most significant holiday of the year in Western culture. Especially in the Alpine regions of Central and Northern Europe, where the Christmas observance has incorporated pre-Christian traditions of decking halls with boughs of holly, evergreens and mistletoe to symbolize winter's inability to prevent the renewal of life. Merrymaking came to have a share in Christmas observance through popular enthusiasm. The medieval secular celebrations lasted for a "season," extending from Christmas eve to Epiphany: also Christmas Day. **2.** same as Christmastide

myrrh (mūr) *n.* [M.E. *mirre* < OE. *myrre* & OFr. *mirre*, both < L. *myrrha* < Gr. *myrrha* < Ar. *myrr*, myrrh, bitter] **1.** an aromatic, bitter tasting gum resin which oozes from gashes cut in the bark of a low shrub like desert tree known as the Dindin tree (*Commiphora myrrha*) common to the arid regions of the Middle East. The sap forms hard, ochre-colored tear-dropped shaped chunks that are powdered or made into ointments or perfumes. Myrrh was one of the gifts of the Magi or wise men. [Mt 2:11] Legend says Caspar brought the gift of myrrh from Europe or Tarsus and placed it before the Christ Child. Named for its bitter taste which, with its funerary uses, has caused it to be associated with the bitter things of life. When burned as incense, myrrh is a symbol of prayers rising to heaven. **6.** any of of these plants; esp., any of several small trees of the genus *Commiphora*.

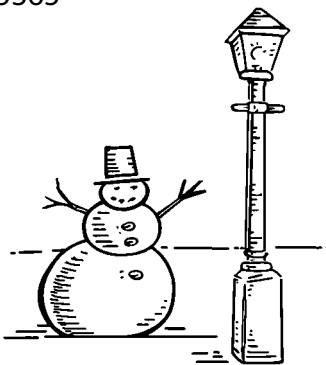

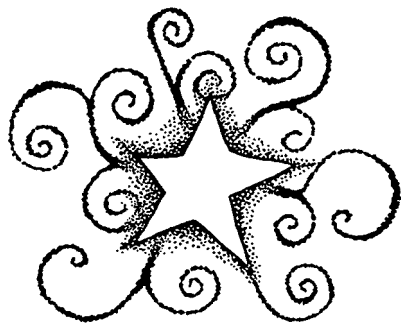

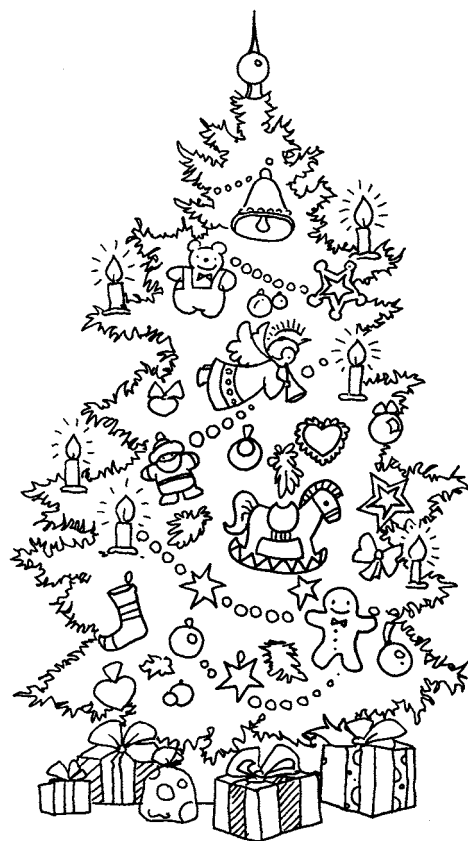
